



# Group Walks | Risk Assessment

Every walk is different, so complete a risk assessment for each one you lead to help you plan and make a note of the steps you are taking to keep walkers safe. After a walk, risk assessments should be stored for three years. Each walk leader can keep their own risk assessments, or groups can choose someone to look after them.

<b>Traffic</b> Do you need to cross or walk along a road? Are there any level crossings?		Check for suitable crossing places on the recce	X
		Communicate clearly with the group on the day	X
		Maintain single file on any road sections	X

<b>Path surface and obstacles</b> Are there hazards such as slippery paths, loose rocks, stiles, fallen trees, steep drops?		Check for hazards on the recce and adapt the route if needed	X
		Provide clear information to walkers beforehand	X
		Advise walkers to bring suitable footwear for the conditions	
		Other/Detail:	
<b>Animals</b>		Let walkers know to cross fields with livestock calmly and quietly, keeping the group together. Be prepared to divert if needed	
		Leave gates and property as you find them	X
		Advise walkers to check for ticks and remove promptly if found
