## Waveney Ramblers Waveney Way 11 Saint Margaret and James

Park on the grassy verge opposite the church of Saint Margaret of Antioch.

Head NW along The Street, church left. Turn left, west, church left.

Turn right, north, on a footpath and head down to The Beck and cross over.

Turn left, west, and follow The Beck, stream left.

Optionally vivit the church of Saint George.

Turn left, south, and cross The Beck. Head SE up Fox Hill.

Left at the fork. Right at the next fork.

Before Saint Cross Farm, turn right, SW, and drop down to the valley.

In the dip, turn left, SE, and head through grazing. There might be cattle.

Optionally divert via the Minster Ruins (recommended).

Continue south through more grazing.

It might be better to cross the steam, mid meadow. The bridge is overgrown.

Head SE towards Park Barn.

After a pond, kink left and right and head SE, hedge right.

Turn right, SW, hedge right.

Turn left, SE, hedge and ditch right.

Turn left, NE, towards Mill Lane.

Head right, SE, along Mill Lane.

Merge into The Street and head SW.

Before the village hall and Saint James Lane, turn sharp left, east.

Follow the woodland path to the church of Saint James.

Optionally visit the church. After the church, turn left, north.

Cross Saint James Road and continue north, soon NW, hedge left.

At a T, turn right, NE, hedge right.

Follow the path as it bends left, north. Head through the Eel's Foot farm buildings.

At a tarmac T, turn left, west, and head to Old Hall Farm.

Turn right, NW, still towards Old Hall Farm.

After the farm, continue NW to fishing lakes. Head NW between the lakes.

Exit the fishing area and turn left, NW, towards Frog Hall.

Cross a cultivated garden and exit onto Mill Lane. Head right, NW.

Turn right, NE, uphill on tarmac. The road bends left, north.

Soon after the bend, turn right, NE, on a footpath.

Cross the second field, NE, avoiding the grounds of the Old Rectory.

Cross another field, NE, and head through the churchyard to return to the parking.

This walk lacks refreshments. The Rumburgh Buck and the Homersfield Black Swan are close.
